

Eye Injury Quick Reference – Dogs

Clinical Guide for Veterinary Teams

Signs of Eye Injury

- Squinting or inability to open the eye
- Excess tearing
- Redness or irritation
- Pawing at the eye or face
- Cloudiness or change in eye color
- Discharge (green/yellow or excessive)
- Sensitivity to light

Common Causes

- Play-related scratches or roughhousing
- Debris, dust, or foreign material
- Excessive rubbing or irritation
- Insect bites or stings
- Blunt trauma or impact
- Chemical exposure

What to Do

- Do NOT attempt treatment without veterinary guidance
- Avoid non-prescribed eye drops
- Evaluate promptly
- Refer to ophthalmology when indicated

When to Consider Eye Serum

- Suspected corneal injury or ulcer
- Ocular surface instability
- Adjunct to antibiotic therapy
- Support healing and comfort
- When rapid deployment is needed
